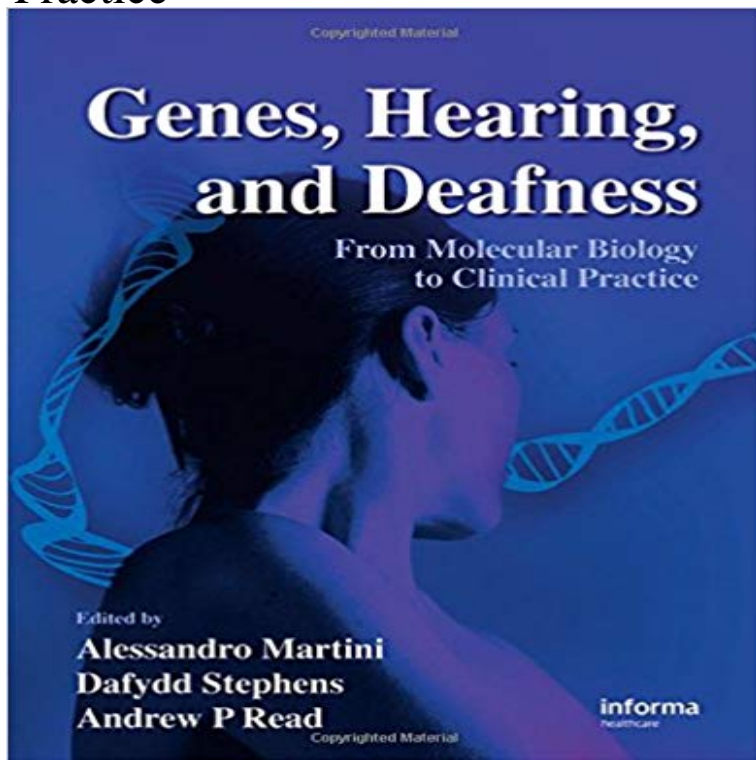


Genes, Hearing, and Deafness: From Molecular Biology to Clinical Practice
