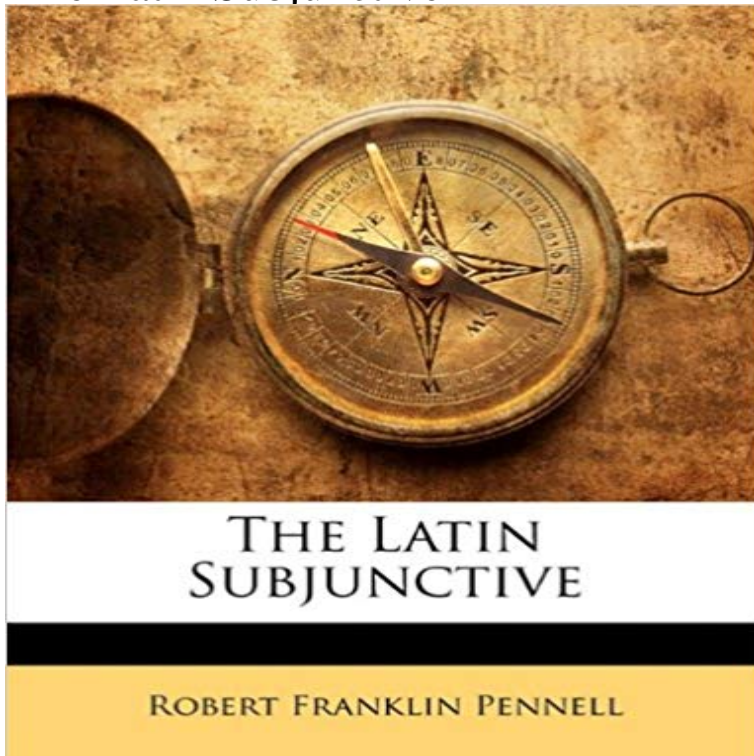


The Latin Subjunctive
